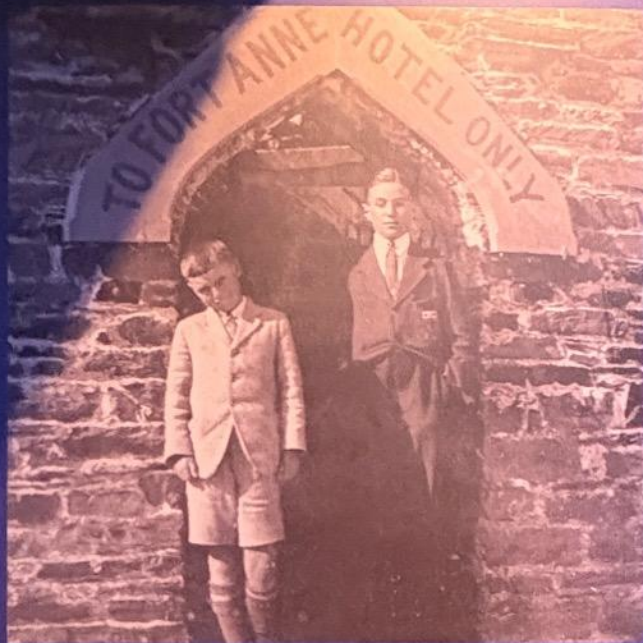

Hear Us: Sounds of the Sea

This is the writer Malcolm Lowry (born in New Brighton, Wirral, in 1909) and his older brother Russell on the Isle of Man in 1920. In the 1950s, Lowry wrote about the beauty of the Isle of Man, his love of the sea, and the importance of caring for the natural world in a set of short stories titled after the Manx fishermen's hymn *Hear Us O Lord From Heaven Thy Dwelling Place*.

Hear Us: Sounds of the Sea

Chris Watson, passionate conservationist and one of the world's leading sound recordists (best known for his award-winning work with David Attenborough for the BBC), has been visiting the Isle of Man to explore and record underwater sounds. In this corridor you can hear recordings from the various Marine Nature Reserves around the island — featuring limpets, pistol shrimp, dolphins and seals, as well as human-made sounds such as ships' engines.
