


MALCOLM LOWRY

To mark the 70th anniversary of Malcolm Lowry's seminal novel *Under the Volcano* (1947) artists Alan Dunn, Martin Heidop and Jeff Young developed a series of performances and posters reconnecting Lowry with his New Brighton birthplace. Working with retired seafarers from the Wirral and sound artists from Yorkshire and Mexico, the artists re-imagined New Brighton's seafaring links with musical stroboscopes and lyrical poems driven by Mercury tides.

Across the 42-minute composition, Jeff Young's words fuse with Heidop's soundtracks, reflecting upon Lowry's leaving of Liverpool at a young age, the empty River Mersey seen by the old men taking model ships to New Brighton every Sunday and the seafarers who navigated Vietnam in Shell tankers as we landed on the moon.






## DECKHAND WITH A UKULELE.

### SCHOOLBOY'S WORLD SEARCH FOR INSPIRATION.

Fresh from Les College, Cambridge, Malcolm Lowe, the seventeen-year-old son of a Liverpool station master, who left Liverpool last Saturday as a deckhand at £2.10 a month on the steamer "Pomona," is going on a tramp voyage to the Far East, sailing at Port Said, Shanghai, and finally Yokohama.

Young Lowe, who lives with his parents at Ingleside, Childs Lane, told a local representative today, that he desired to see something of the world and gain some experience of life before going to the university.

The voyage will last eight months and, during that time

I shall work just the same as the other members of the crew. I shall not receive—and I don't want—any privileges.

#### WRITING AND COMPOSING.

"The work will keep me fit, and will be a good thing for me. As I write short dances and compose dance music I hope to get fresh atmosphere and inspiration."

I shall take my ukelele with me, and when off watch shall try to think out some new dance tunes. Ronald Hill, a school chum of mine, and I have written several "Charlestons," one of which, "Three Little Doggies," was the mentioned in the "Echo" dancing notes some weeks ago, has already been published.

Other dance tunes we have composed are "Hindoo Babe," "You Got to Play Hot Rhythms," "Dread Man's a'Coming on a Train of Stars," "Dreadal Stomp," "Dreadal Blues," and "I've Said Goodbye to Shanty."

Lowe, who won the Hoylake Boys' Golf Championship in 1925, is a brother of W. M. Lowe, the Birkenhead Park and international Hockey player.
