DEVELOPMENTS AT THE BLUECOAT

During the coming months, work will be in progress marking the first stage in a three phase project to develop the concert hall and adjacent areas into a fully equipped performance space with a more convivial atmosphere for our patrons' enjoyment. Work undertaken in this first stage will include the provision of a permanent lighting grid in the hall and the conversion of the nearby annexe into a bar. This work has been made possible by the financial assistance of the Granada Foundation and Higson's Brewery Ltd., to whom we are most grateful.

The next stage of the project will be to provide a raised seating unit; we feel sure that members of our audiences will appreciate how vital this is to complement the lighting grid, particularly for dance and mime performances.

June 18-July 17 **GRAHAM CROWLEY AND TIM JONES**

Figures, or at least evidence of a human presence, feature in both these artists' work, which also shares a vigorous and fresh approach towards painting. In Crowley's pictures, clumsy, cartoon-like choracters, electrical appliances out of control or domestic objects with a mind of their own enact a drama at times both violent and humorous. Jones, now artist in residence at Lewisham having previously shared a studio with Crowley, intuitively works on paintings, from which emerge images evocative of music, as in the 'Piano' series or voyage.

FRANK AND BRIDGET EGERTON

A selection of brightly painted wooden toys, featuring amusing animals and figures, by two toymakers working in the region.

BLUECOAT SUMMER SCULPTURE EXHIBITION

Sculpture, displayed both indoors and outdoors, in this mixed exhibition selected from an open submission of work by sculptors working in the North of England. Though not a comprehensive survey of contemporary sculpture in the area, the show nonetheless concentrates on some of the most interesting and innovative work currently being done representing a variety of processes — carving, assembling, casting — and a range of materials — stone, wood, metal, actual objects. Artists include David Brodie, Neil Talbot, Edmund Tillotson and Fred Watson.
