

# **SUMMER DANCE '85**

## Introduction

Summer Dance '85 at the Bluecoat is again bigger and more exciting than any of our previous dance festivals. Concerned with promoting the many aspects of dance and mime we have asked artists, performers and musicians from all over Britain to work at the Bluecoat for a period of five weeks, giving a total of 10 performances and 16 workshops between 29 June and 3 August. Some of the artists performing will be **Laurie Booth, Peta Lily, Gregory Nash, Howard and Eberle** and **Theatre de Complicite.** There will also be several performances by the many youth dance groups around Merseyside. Reduced prices for season tickets and block bookings are available (see back of leaflet for details).

## SATURDAY 29TH JUNE at 7.30p.m.

The Cardiff based Howard & Eberle Dance Theatre come to the Bluecoat in a dual role. As well as performing their current show *On the Rocks* they will be giving a collaborative performance with Merseyside Youth Association's Dance Group.

On the Rocks is a spectacular fusion of dance and live music. In this, the company's fourth full length show, Howard & Eberle are joined by musician John Hardy. On the Rocks is a completely new genre of entertainment in which the three performers are a live band who play and sing within a web of tightly choreographed high energy dances.

Merseyside Youth Association Dance Group is a collection of young people (15-20) from all parts of Merseyside interested in dance and music. The performance will be a result of a week's tuition and choreography with Howard & Eberle, the scheme being subsidized by the Arts Council.

Laurie Booth returns to the Bluecoat to give a workshop and a performance of his new show Yip Yip Mix and the Twentieth Century.

This is an improvised collaboration between Laurie Booth and performance artist Phillip Jeck.

One plays records, the other dances, the simplified and most basic unit of sound and movement.

The performance however is given a basic twist by the way in which the dancer subverts and re-defines notions of movement. The performers test each other with wit and skill, leading one another through a labyrinth of bizarre and comic choices.

## FRIDAY 5th JULY at 7.30p.m.

Peta Lily returns to the Bluecoat (previously here with Three Women Mime in February 82) with her new show. Whole Parts.

WHOLE PARTS is the title of Peta Lily's latest show first presented at the London International Mime Festival '85 to much acclaim. Full of wit and visual impact Whole Parts has a strong cabaret flavour.

The two contrasting sections balance acutely captured emotion with outrageous black humour and are propelled by Lily's distinctive feminine dynamic which combines fluid sensitivity with a robust energy.

#### Women's Parts (1st half)

a powerful cinematic piece which superimposes images of woman over and beside each other, with a central motif suggesting an empress in so many veils, unwinding to join the primitive to the future in a kind of sacred striptease.

#### Hiroshima Mon Amour (2nd half)

is a biting black comedy. A clapped out trouper performs her interpretations of Edith Piaf classics for a shell shocked audience on her final world tour.

Gregory Nash comes to the Bluecoat for a one week residency of workshops, tuition and choreography, culminating in two performances on Friday and Saturday. As well as giving contemporary dance classes during the week Gregory will be working with a group of young dancers picked from around Merseyside (and as with Howard & Eberle on the 29th June) culminating in two performances at the end of the week. Collaborating with Gregory Nash on this project to create music and visuals will be Jim Beirne (Music and Dance Director at the Bluecoat) and Jonathan Froud (currently artist in residence at the Walker Art Gallery).

The other part of this double bill for Fri/Sat is Greg's solo show:

# GREGORY NASH — SOLO DANCER POSITIONS OF STRENGTH

This hour long dance theatre piece combines choreography by Gregory Nash, Super 8 films by Ricky Knight, and scripts by Gregory Hayman. The mood shifts from the light-hearted to the serious and moving; the pace from striking theatrical images to fast high-energy movement sequences, mostly using popular music.

**Gregory Nash** has danced with **Cycles, Mantis, Dancework, Michael Clark** and in the United States with **Dance Gallery.** He has choreographed for many youth, community and professional companies in England and Scotland and has taught and performed extensively throughout Great Britain and abroad. Much of his time is now spent touring and leading residencies involving classes, performances and community participation events.
