
PARABLE ISLAND some aspects of recent Irish art Part 2

Bob Sloan: Tyrone Bottle

As its subtitle indicates, this two part exhibition focuses on aspects of contemporary art practice in Ireland, both the Republic and Northern Ireland, by presenting two overlapping exhibitions. Part Two focuses predominantly upon the social and the political, exploring various themes, from the Troubles to the territorial imperatives of power and sexuality. The artists are Marie Barrett, Colm Brennan. Michael Bulfin, Cathy Carman, Rita Duffy, Brendan Ellis, Graham Gingles, Gerry Gleason, Patrick Graham, Catherine Harper, Brian Maquire, Jack Pakenham, Vivienne Roche, Victor Sloan. 20 April - 4 May **VIDEO POSITIVE 91**

The largest video arts festival of its kind in the UK. the first Video Positive drew over 30,000 visitors in 1989. This year's event includes video installations from around the world and is being staged at venues across Liverpool

At the Bluecoat, installations range from the dramatic and spectacular Fujiyama Pyramid Project by Peter Callas. Australia's foremost videographic artist, here receiving its European premiere, to Judith Goddard's The Garden of Earthly Delights. A Video Positive commission enjoying its world premiere, this 90s version of the Bosch painting mixes state-of-the-art techniques with montage. humour and social comment to present a surreal picture of contemporary life. Triune – another World premiere – by American artist Tony Oursler, features a giant

aargoyle's head and an oil drum that seems to leak video images. Oursler's work comments on the way society turns the world into a giant trash can. Catherine Elwes in (Wishing) Well, an intimate and unsettling installation originally commissioned by Hull Time Based Arts, continues her ongoing concern with the mother/child relationship.

In addition, the Bluecoat's performance space upstairs is the site for the premiere of three new locally produced video installations made through the Video Positive Community and Education Programme. Netherton Activity Centre presents Mist upon the Mersey (23-26 April & 30 April-4 May), while South Mersey College shows Paying for Chaos (23-26 April). The installation was produced with the assistance of Louise Forshaw, who also helped St Helens College Women into Media students take the viewer on a Magical Mystery Tour (30 April-4 May).
















11 May – 8 June INTIMATE DISTANCE

A Photographers' Gallery, London Touring Exhibition

the work of five women who have made a significant impact on contemporary art and photography in Britain. 11 May – 8 June MAUD SULTER Studies for a National Postage Stamp home through photographs of a marriage. **Sutapa Biswas** explores, through a series of projected images, the experience of displacement from the Indian Sub-Continent.

In this series of drawings and paintings, Maud Sulter currently Momart Artist in Residence at Tate Gallery Liverpool – explores the ambivalence of creating beauty from chaos. Since the early 80's, the artist has been developing this style of abstractive figuration, from smaller, more interior pieces to the current larger, more provocative studies, in which the sensuality of line and colour are countered by the series' title, Studies for a National Postage Stamp. A further work Akua Ma was sponsored by British Telecom with a 1990 New Contemporaries enabling award.



15 June – 13 July STRIP SEARCH 2 The new breed of comics

Hailed by City Limits, the London listings magazine, as 'the biggest and best comic exhibition so far seen in this country', the first Strip Search exhibition attracted a huge response when shown last year. Strip Search 2, a bigger, more comprehensive, updated selection of comic art, offers a dazzling display of over 150 different comic strips, the majority as original artworks. The exhibition traces the development of today's new breed of comics, starting from familiar classics like Little Nemo, Dan Dare, Tin Tin and Spider Man, through to the recent phenomenon of the graphic novel, typified by Art Spiegelman's Maus, published by Penguin. Broken down into thematic sections, the exhibition will show the best work from

Broken down into thematic sections, the exhibition will show the best work from Europe, USA and Japan. With the growing acceptance of graphic novels into libraries and the book trade, and the wider public awareness of the comic genre through book signings, launches, discussions and workshops, Strip Search 2 offers an opportunity to assess this developing and increasingly sophisticated popular art form.

Arranged in association with Camden Arts and Entertainments and Escape magazine, Strip Search 2 is accompanied by a fully illustrated catalogue containing specially commissioned essays on aspects of comic art. The exhibition will be complemented by a display showcasing the best comic strips produced locally, and will be the focus for a series of talks and practical workshohops offering skills and advice for those interested in drawing or publishing their own comics. These events are being co-ordinated with


