

NEW ART NORTH WEST

As the two arts associations, Merseyside Arts and North West Arts, merge into an arts board serving this enlarged region, the Bluecoat, in conjunction with Moviola and Artreach is collaborating with two Manchester galleries, Cornerhouse and Castlefield, on a major survey of new art from the North West.


Running concurrently at these venues, the exhibition features over 30 artists and was selected from an open submission. At the Bluecoat Julian Beesley, Mark Bradley, Bimla Dass, Moses Lee, (who is also showing at Manchester's Chinese Arts Centre), Duncan Mountford, Sue Platt, Jill Randall, Roxy Walsh, and Jonathan Woolfenden exhibit paintings and sculptures. Jon Biddulph's Wherehouse installation transforms a gallery space into a 'cardboard city', whilst Anneke Pettikan's environmental sculptures have been specially made in response to the garden courtyard. Sarah Pucill's films are being shown on video in the café bar, and Peter

New Art North West also provides the opportunity to stage several highly public projects beyond the gallery, in Liverpool City Centre. Most of these temporary artworks developed out of proposals made for specific locations, and they reflect the growing number of artists in the region seeking a more direct public engagement for their work.

Those Environmental Artists (TEA) present Living Spaces at four sites, Chevasse Park, Bold Street, Canning Place and Argyle Street. Phil Bews' sculpture Deal Porters is on the quayside at Merseyside Maritime Museum. British Rail stations provide sites for two artists: Simon Redman's textual paintings, concerning travel, at Lime St and Geoff Molyneux's railway sleeper installation on platforms at Edge Hill and in Manchester at Oxford Road. Streamline, a sculptural video installation by Chris Meigh-Andrews, is being staged at Mercury Court in Tithebarn St,

RESILESS SHADOWS Contemporary Japanese Fibreworks

Organised By Goldsmiths'
Gallery London (with
sponsorship from the Crafts
Council, Great Britain
Sasakawa Foundation and

textile artist Michael BrennandWood, this exhibition features
the work of ten artists:-

Machiko Agano, Katsuhiro Fujimura, Nobuko Hiroi, Masakazu Kobayashi, Naomi Kobayhashi, Jun Mitsuhashi, Satoru Shoji, Yuko Takada, Teruyoshi Yoshida and Masao Yoshimura.

They represent the innovative developments that have taken place over the past decade in Japanese fibre art, a period that has seen a movement away from a traditional textile activity to a vigorous art practice described by Brennand-Wood as Post Fibre - whose expressive potential is being explored by fine artists and craft practitioners alike. Most of the work on display is three dimensional and uses a wide range of materials, chosen as much for their sociological, ritualistic and archaeological associations as for their formal qualities.


