
- The Bluecoat is a Grade 1 Listed Queen Anne building the oldest building in Liverpool city centre, dating from 1717. For most of this century, it has been a centre for the arts in Liverpool and today continues to promote a wide range of arts activities, as well as being home to a large number of cultural organisations and individual artists.
- How to find us. We are situated just off Church St, behind Littlewoods.
- Public Transport By train to Central or Lime Street stations which are only a few minutes away. Bus routes into city centre Liverpool which stop by Williamson Square and Paradise Street Bus Station.
- Disabled Vibileri The Bluecoat is ramped at the front entrance in School Lane to give access to the ground floor, gallery, bookshop, café bar, Sandon Room and toilets, and at the rear entrance in College Lane, to give access to the Display Centre and gardens. 

Last year's **Summer in the City** demonstrated that the Bluecoat, with its central location, garden courtyard, shops, café bar, and activities both inside and outside, provides a unique experience for visitors to the city centre over the Summer. Following 1994's successful event, *Summer in the City 95*, again highlights what the building has to offer. During three weeks in July and August, there's dance and street theatre outside, whilst the Bluecoat garden hosts music nights and a series of early evening poetry gatherings. As part of **MILAP 95** Festival of Indian Arts, the popular family day has been brought forward from its traditional Autumn slot. Other day long attractions include comic, book and record fairs, and the Bluecoat's facilities, including the café bar, extend their opening hours during part of the period. **On The Horizon**, a unique collaborative music project involving **Raw Material** and local groups comes to fruition with a special performance, and there's an opportunity too for young people to participate in dance and art workshops. Some of the Bluecoat's resident artists will be opening their studios to the public, as well as exhibiting in the gallery, joining sculptor **Juginder Lamba**, whose wood carvings are also on display in the garden courtyard. Our thanks are again due to Liverpool City Centre Partnership for its generous support of Summer in the City.



Science Friction Art From Cologne



Four artists from Cologne - Frauke Barow, Brigitte Burgmer, Harald Fuchs and Freddie Soethout - are included in this, the fourth in a series of exhibition exchanges held since 1987 between the Bluecoat and the BBK Gallery in Liverpool's German twin city. As suggested by the exhibition title, there is an openness on the part of the artists to integrate aspects of science in their work, whilst remaining sceptical about notions of 'scientific truth.' Surface Tension, the reciprocal exhibition by four Liverpool artists, Sue Fitch, David Mabb, Katherine Moonan and Simon Robertshaw takes place in Cologne this September. Cross – Currents New Art From Senegal

As part of a developing dialogue with artists in Senegal, the Bluecoat presents recent paintings, sculpture and mixed media works by Jean-Marie Bruce, Fode Camara, Serigne Mbaye Camara, Moustapha Dime, Abdoulaye Ndoye, Cheikh Niass, Kan-Si and El Hadji Sy. Working at the forefront of one of Africa's most vital centres for contemporary art, this group displays a fascinating diversity of approaches, from Cheikh Niass' playful assemblages made from objects found on the beach, to El Hadji Sy's elegant kites and paintings on rice sacks; from Moustapha Dime's totemic sculptures, to Fode Camara's painted memorial to Goree, the former slave fort off the coast of Dakar.
