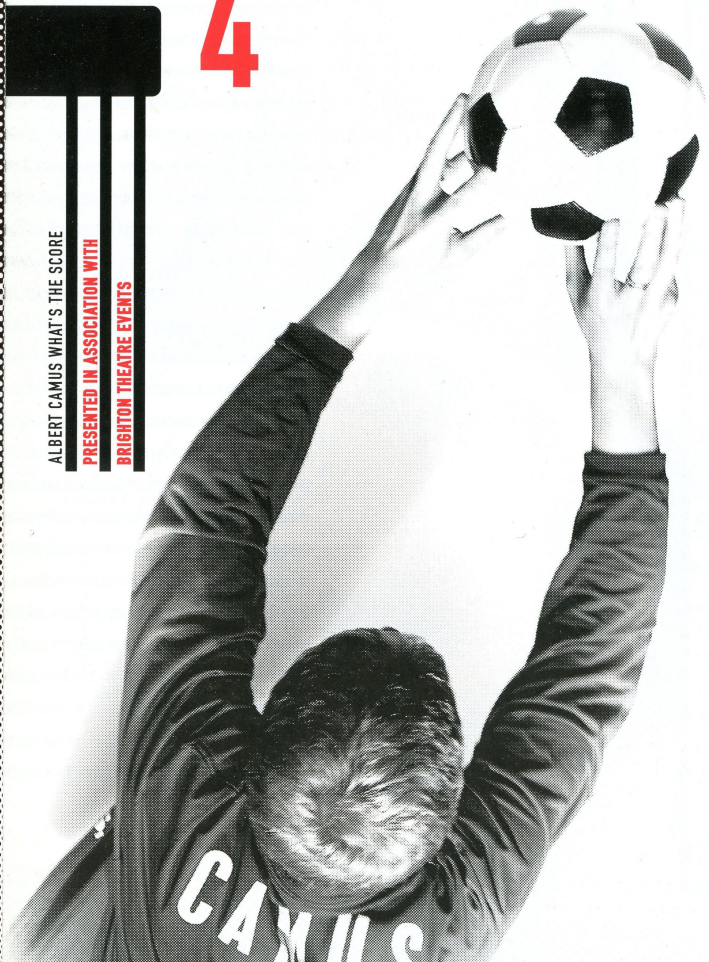

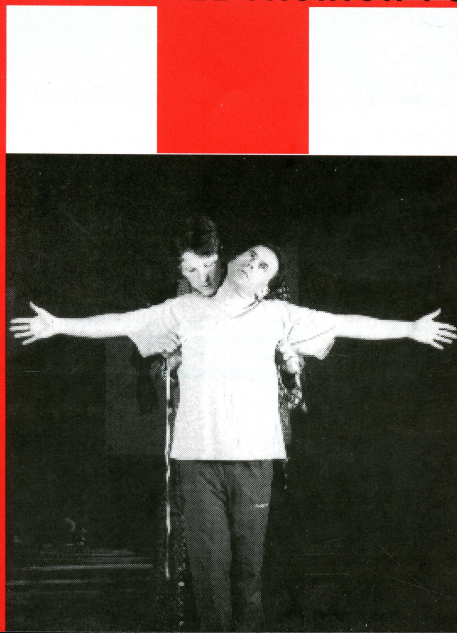

Liverpool based artist Alan Dunn is the Bluecoat's exclusive F.A.I.R. – Football Artist in Residence – throughout Euro'96. After an arduous qualifying campaign which has brought him to Liverpool from his birth-place in Glasgow, via the television traumas of Argentina'78 and previous football art projects in America and Germany, Dunn takes up position in June. ¶ The Bluecoat will be resplendent, its Concert Hall windows decorated, the courtyard awash with footballing banners and footballs in the trees. A series of advertising hoardings will be transformed into a daily visual diary of the championship, as Dunn, paintbrush in hand, responds on site to the results, highlights and dramas as they happen, both on and off the pitch. ¶ Further banners on a football theme will be displayed in the courtyard, the results of an ongoing project involving young people from Dingle and Speke/Garston, coordinated by ARTSKILLS. ¶ In Café Europa – see page 13 – F.A.I.R. presents an exhibition celebrating the genre of football record sleeves, with assistance from both invited international artists and others who have supplied material locally. ¶ F.A.I.R. workshops and drop in activities will be arranged for the Bluecoat front courtyard to coincide with some of the more crucial ties. Further details announced during the tournament.
