

The cluster of international works at the Bluecoat forms an intriguing counterpoint to the trio of large-scale projection pieces at Tate Gallery Liverpool. Video here is pared back to less than zero - yet despite their ultra-minimalist outline, these four pieces imprint themselves vividly on the mind. The ability of sound to conjure its own evocative visual landscape is a feature of most of the work. The repeated emphasis on dialogue (between disembodied voices, between audience and artwork, or between the gallery and an off-site location) encourages a more subtle and intuitive form of interactivity than that promoted by push-button digital technology. With their accent on relationships, networks and communities, these four pieces sound a welcome note of humanity within an encroaching and occasionally alienating digital world.

Motherlode and Superchannel have been commissioned as part of FACT's collaboration programme. One Bit Louder is curated by Micz Flor.


# **NERVOUS KINGDOM**

#### Saturday 13 May – Saturday 24 June FREE Admission

One of art's most enduring fallacies is based on the premise that even the most imaginative and experimental art is reassuringly rooted in a mastery of drawing - a virtuoso skill with the pencil. However, in this exhibition the artists skirt round the easels of objectivity, pay the model scant regard, and let their graphic urges run free. They use drawing not as notation or sketchy preparation for the big art statement, but as a medium in its own right – direct, sensitive, immediate, though not particularly unmediated.

Drawing finds fresh impetus here through an engaging diversity of graphic approaches, including cartoon strips, graffiti messages, imagined urban topographies, philosophical musings, private doodles and bizarre partatives

The images are humourous and sublime, childlike and disturbing, obsessive and throwaway, and reveal a world that is anxious and paranoid, yet open to possibilities – an articulation of the sense of unease, restlessness and dislocation in contemporary life.

Bluecoatconnect, the Bluecoat's educational outreach project is set to culminate with a celebratory series of events and an exhibition at the Bluecoat in January 2001, bringing the achievements of this exciting and innovative project to a wider public.

One year of Bluecoatconnect. In just over one year, the project has introduced hundreds of people in Liverpool to a broad range of contemporary art

(dance, video, music, visual and live art), through workshops with artists, while tackling issues about social exclusion and inclusion, cultural enrichment, identity and independence.

In addition to high quality installations and performances, the project has given its participants new skills. A group of young people from Rice Lane City Farm for example have independently written their own mixed media performance about life in Walton. Much more can be achieved if Bluecoat*connect* continues beyond 2001.

Who is involved? The groups involved include local schools, young people from Rice Lane City Farm, Elimu Study School, and Merseyside Youth Association, and adults from British Chinese Forum, Fazakerley Central Day Services and Silent View. The project aims to articulate the participants' views of how they see their place in the world, giving voice to ideas about independence, identity and home.

> The Future Bluecoatconnect is laying the foundations for the Bluecoat's long term objective to improve access to its programme through participatory arts and engage with new audiences, both young and old.


